NO DIAGNOSIS: DRAWINGS BY PAINTERS organized by Ivy Shapiro

June 7 – July 18, 2025

Much has been written about the role of the accident, or chance, in the recent history of painting. A canvas transfigured by an unplanned chemical synthesis; a painstakingly plotted grid shaded in hues determined by a random sequence of numbers; an oeuvre elaborated out of a fortuitous spill—a drip, a stain. Painting, the artist Terry Winters has remarked, is "a combination of carpentry and catastrophe. There are parts of the painting process that are civilized: a deliberate application of procedures. I take pleasure in that . . . But then, at a certain point, the carpentry needs to hit the catastrophe. That instability allows for significant or surprising things to happen, or at least the possibility."

Far less, however, has been made of the generative possibilities of the accident in drawing—a medium often underestimated exactly for its more evidently spontaneous tendencies. Where many painters invested in the aleatory go to great lengths to remove evidence of their hand from the finished works (don't forget, you need a system to court chance), the act of drawing can be seductively liberating. Cleaved from subjectivity, the autonomous artwork can get a little chilly all on its own. The artist's tangible presence—and all the subjecthood and human error that implies—is a thaw. After all, accidents are notoriously messy; disorder begets disorder; failure burns and spreads like a full-body blush.

Many of the drawings collected in No diagnosis bear traces of the hands that made them. For some of the twenty-four participating artists, their drawings are no less process-based, no more nakedly confessional, than the oil or acrylic (or, or, or . . .) compositions they render on sturdier supports. For others, drawing—a method, many artists will argue, not bound to the two-dimensional—is as material as the psyche gets, an image-transmission straight from the subconscious. Spanning generations, media, methods, and conceptual approaches, these painters are nonetheless united in their embrace of accidents, chance, and even the possibility of failure in their work.

Here, it matters less which medium is primary than how each informs and recontextualizes the other. Perhaps their drawings are rendered with all the formal rigor of their paintings. Or maybe their paintings are as improvisatory and uninhibited as any drawing made with no end (stretcher bar, gloved handler, viewer, reviewer) in sight. Painting as a historical category carries associations of completeness or finality. Unburdened, drawing proliferates. Mishaps, surprise, catastrophe—all serve to jolt us out of any semblance of control, of mastery. The artists here relish in this infinitude.
